Scene 1

Plot: Brief note about the plot, what's going on?

Themes: What themes have you identified and how are they developed in the play?

Symbols: What symbols were identified? To whom do they apply and how?

Tone / Mood and passage: What is the overall mood in the scene? Identify a passage that supports your description. How does the language used help create the characters?

Questions for reflection and class discussion (answer at least one of these questions per scene)

What things do the characters do or say that you find uncharacteristic or contradictory to how Williams has developed them?

How do the stage directions help develop the scene? What changes would you recommend?

Is there a line that you are unsure of how it should be spoken?

What was confusing or didn't work for you? How would you have done it differently?

What were you surprised by? What did you find predictable?

Who do you envision as the protagonist in this play?

Because this play is recalled from Tom's memory, what scenes do you find suspect?

How do the themes interact with the symbols?
